Policy 512: Mechanic Duty Statement

- 1. The Scotts Valley Fire Protection District mechanic shall hold the position of firefighter II, as a minimum, and will be paid in accordance with the district memorandum of understanding, if assigned.
- 2. The mechanic will report to the operations chief in charge of apparatus and will keep him/her informed and up-to-date as to the needs and progress of repairs and maintenance.
- 3. The mechanic's assignment will include the following areas of responsibility, within his/her capability, above and beyond the responsibilities of the engineer. These responsibilities will be performed in such a manner as to not deter from performing his/her customary duties. In addition, this position does not relieve district firefighters and engineers from assuring apparatus is consistently in safe working order.
 - Safety inspections and other routine inspections and record keeping to comply with state and local requirements.
 - Repair and replacement of mechanical and electrical parts, drive systems, suspension systems, brake systems, fuel systems, steering systems, electrical systems, cooling systems, main fire pumps, priming pump, etc.
 - Preventive maintenance, lubrication, and inspection of apparatus and equipment.
 - Order and maintain necessary parts, lubricants, and supplies.
 - Maintain records of all work and costs.
 - Assist in budget recommendations for repair and maintenance activities.
 - Be available to perform emergency and/or other repairs off duty as needs may dictate.

4. Minimum Qualifications

- Hold the position of firefighter II for the Scotts Valley Fire Protection District.
- Five (5) years in the department, or equivalent experience.
