#### PURPOSE

This document is to serve as the operational plan to facilitate the Automatic Aid agreement between Santa Cruz County Fire Department and Scotts Valley Fire Protection District. This plan will include the following items:

#### Areas of Response

Each jurisdiction will provide automatic aid as follows:

- 1. Scotts Valley shall respond into those areas delineated and enclosed by a solid line on the attached map identified as Area A and Area C.
- 2. Santa Cruz County Fire shall respond into those areas delineated and enclosed by a solid line on the attached map to Area C.

#### Guidelines Governing Response to an Emergency

Emergencies which require the use of red lights and sirens by responding fire vehicles shall be part of this agreement. Calls for public service, post fire investigations and responses which do not require the use of red lights and sirens by the responding fire vehicles shall not be a part of this agreement. These calls shall be handled by the responsible jurisdiction.

#### Types of Response

Scotts Valley Fire shall provide automatic aid within the areas of response to all incidents as follows:

Area A:			
Structure fires	1 engine, 1 water tender		
Wildland fires	1 engine, 1 water tender		
All others	First alarm assignment		
Area C:			
All incidents	First alarm assignment		
Ocean St. Extension:			
All incidents	1 engine		

Santa Cruz County Fire shall provide automatic aid within the areas of response to all incidents as follows:

Area B:	
Structure fires	1 engine and 1 water tender
Wildland fires	1 engine and 1 water tender
All others	First alarm assignment

#### Communications/Dispatch

Reports of emergencies shall be directed to the jurisdictional dispatch center. Automatic aid will be called for by the jurisdictional dispatch center after interrogation of the reporting party.

Both agencies will make every effort to use the dispatch center of jurisdiction when working in an automatic aid area.

Command and tactical nets shall be identified by the Communication Center or incident commander.

All resources should be ordered on the command net through the Communication Center at jurisdiction.

The incident commander shall make every effort to utilize common radio nets.

#### Resource Availability

Neither agency is obligated to send resources to an incident if it depletes resources below an acceptable level as determined by that agency.

#### Jurisdictional Responsibility

When both jurisdictions are responding to an emergency along a common border, and jurisdictional responsibility has been identified by arriving units, the jurisdiction providing aid in accord with this agreement shall work under the direction of the responsible jurisdiction.
