Mr. Pehling reviewed the following: Independent Auditor's Report with no misstatements, Management Discussion completed by Fire Chief Whittle and Administrative Services Manager Walton for an overview of the financials, Financial Statements including the Governmental Accounting Standards used to report pension and retiree healthcare liability, Fiduciary Funds Financial Statements for SCHMIT and notes to the Financial Statements.

7. Board of Directors and Administrative Reports – Information/Discussion

7.1 <u>Board of Directors Report – Directors</u>

Director Campbell reported that the Ad Hoc Committee met on 11/30/2021 to discuss the LAFCO report. Director Patterson, Fire Chief Whittle, Battalion Chiefs LoFranco and McNeil and Captain Petteys attended the meetings and discussed the Branciforte Fire Protection District related to the operational impact and potential outcomes.

7.2 <u>Administrative Report - Chief Officers</u>

The Administrative Report was included in the board packet and Chief Whittle reported on the following:

- C-Shift responded to a structure fire on South Navarra Drive. The fire was contained to the work bench in the garage. A citizen walking by the house noticed light smoke from the eaves of the garage and used the Ring doorbell to alert the residents who were not home at the time. The resident answered the Ring doorbell remotely and gave the citizen their door code to get the dog and rabbit out of the house. On arrival, the SVFPD crews quickly extinguished the fire. Along with SCZ and CTL, the crews worked efficiently and safely to knock down the fire and contain the damage to the garage.
- C-Shift responded to an injury accident on Highway 17 at Pasatiempo. There were 4 juveniles in the vehicle and all had significant injuries with 1 entrapment. The crews were able to quickly extricate the trapped patient and all 4 patients were transported by ground ambulance to Valley Medical.
- BC Stubendorff has been working on setting up our transition to Emergency Reporting.
- New Wi-Fi modems are being purchased for the lead engines LP-15 monitors. The modems will allow
 information from the monitors to be directly input into the FF/Paramedic's patient care report. Santa
 Cruz County EMS wants all agencies to have the new modems ready for use by January 1, 2022.
- Engineer Cahir has been searching the rural parts of the SVFPD for private water supplies, bridges and gates to add these items to our CAD maps.
- The County Health and Wellness committee has purchased a large cache of Rehab and Recovery
 equipment utilizing funds set aside by SCCFAIG. The equipment is stored at Central Fire and is available
 for use by all employees.
- Chief Whittle has been working with BC Stubendorff on 2 AFG grants. One is a regional grant hosted by Central Fire for the purchase of Monitors/AEDs. The other grant is to replace our current mobile and portable radios to be compatible with FIRESCOPE Radio Communications Guidelines and provide reliable replacements for our aging radios.

- Initially, Watsonville Community Hospital was due to close 1/28/2022, which is a big concern to have
 one hospital for Santa Cruz County. It has been announced that the Pajaro Valley Healthcare Project is
 looking to purchase the Watsonville Community Hospital so at this point, the Hospital will remain open.
- We are working with County Fire to purchase a SCBA compressor that they have had in storage since 2008. The unit is in good condition and the retro fit will cost approximately \$9,000, which is far less than the amount budgeted to replace the unit.
- At the OES Region 2 Meeting, it was reported that last fire season 500 engines went out, 341 million dollars has been invoiced and 78 prepositions were deployed for potential weather and debris flow using 9.1 million dollars of the allocated 20 million dollars.
- Scotts Valley businesses using tents for outdoor dining have been give notice that by the end of the year, they will need to comply with the building codes that were modified due to the Covid restrictions.

Policy 2101: Committees of the Board of Directors

The Board of Directors of the Scotts Valley Fire Protection District hereby authorizes the following standing committees:

Finance and Planning Committee

The primary role of the Finance and Planning Committee of the Board is to work with staff on development of budgets, financial projections, and financial strategic planning. Recommendations are made to the Board of Directors with regard to budgeting and allocation of financial resources. The Finance and Planning Committee may also meet with the District's auditor, the Santa Cruz County Auditor and other related entities for the purpose of financial planning.

The Board Finance and Planning Committee may conduct routine quarterly reviews of the current financial status of the District as well as spot checking invoices, statements and warrants for conformance with District policies and procedures.

Organization and Personnel Committee

Maintains sufficient policies and procedures to assure efficient personnel management and leadership. Recommends organizational structures to the full Board.

Facilities and Equipment Committee

Conducts capital planning on the replacement, procurement and construction of facilities, apparatus and equipment.

Interagency Committee

The Interagency objectives are to provide a unified source of accurate information on community related matters, demonstrate effective interagency relationships and through transparency build and maintain trust of local public agencies.

Audit Committee

The Audit Committee of the Board of Directors is hereby established as the full Board of Directors of the Scotts Valley Fire Protection District. The purpose of establishing the Audit Committee is to formally identify that the entire Board of Directors has the fiduciary responsibility for oversight of District administration, governance and financial accountability in the interest of the public.

The role of the Audit Committee is to provide oversight and accountability for all aspects of fiscal affairs including:

- Selection and hiring of the financial audit firm
- Audits are performed on an annual basis
- Formal acceptance, in open session, of the audit report
- Assurance that fiscal processes are adequate and being followed
- Payments are made accurately and promptly
- Records and reports are accurate

The purpose of the committee is to conduct detailed analysis and study in the appointed area of District functions and report the findings to the full Board for action.

Meetings of the committees shall be posted to meet the Brown Act provisions of the California Government Code. Minutes of committee meetings are not required to be taken.

Committees shall be appointed by the Board President at the January Board meeting for the calendar year. Each committee shall be composed of two Board members except the Audit Committee which shall be the full Board.

Ad Hoc committees may be established from time to time to deal with specific issues as determined by the Board. The Board President will make such appointments to Ad Hoc committees as required.

Committees of the Board are required to carry out the Board's wishes in the best interest of the District. The committees will report back to the Board monthly based on activities. Committees may not take any formal action. Any action requires a majority vote of the full Board in open or closed session (and reported in open session) as appropriate.

Direct the Fire Chief on how to proceed.

Discussion

In 1979 the Fire District purchased a 1 acre parcel on Glenwood Drive, known as the Marywood Property ("Property"), from the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose ("DSM"). DSM sold the Property to the District for \$4,000. DSM placed a condition subsequent to the conveyance of the Property that requires the District to only use the Property for a fire station. Specially, Section 4 of the Sales Agreement states that the Property is "to be used as the location of a fire station." The Deed also identifies this condition by stating that the Property "shall be used only for the purpose of a Fire Station."

In 2005, the District entered into a land use agreement with the property neighbor, Randall Clayton, for the purpose of keeping no more than 2 horses at any one time. There is a signed agreement on file, and we periodically inspect the property for compliance with the land use agreement.

In 1984, 1995, and again in 2006, DSM issued requests to the District to return the Property to DSM as the District was not using it as a fire station. The District's responses to DSM were that it would likely use it as a fire station in the near future and was therefore not willing to return the land to DSM. In October 2021, DSM again inquired if the District would return the Property to DSM as the District is not using it as a fire station.

District legal counsel has determined that the District is under no obligation to return the Property to DSM even though it is not using it as a fire station. In fact, if the District simply gives the Property to DSM, that would likely be an impermissible gift of public funds in violation of Article XVI, Section 5 & 6, of the California Constitution.

The Districts options moving forward are to maintain ownership of the property for possible future fire station, or research legal options to sell the property utilizing the procedures for public agencies to dispose of surplus property.

Assists District personnel in the interpretation and enforcement of State and local laws and regulations relating to fire prevention. Prepares reports on findings. Prepares and maintains both conventional and electronic inspection records and reports. Issues citations and performs other duties relative to the corrective action necessary to prevent the reoccurrence of fire related crimes or code violations; appears in court as necessary. Subject to periodic duty after normal working hours and in emergencies. Performs other duties as may include supportive or assigned positions on an apparatus.

Policy 505: Administrative Captain Duty Statement

Under the direction of the fire chief, the Administrative Captain will act as the primary fire prevention officer for the District. The Administrative Captain's primary duties include:

- 1. Perform inspections of buildings, processes and properties for fire and life safety hazards and insure code compliance; be responsible for the issuance of fire clearance for licensed facilities and issue permits for specified operations.
- 2. Perform fire investigations for cause and origin.
- 3. Plan-check construction projects and fire protection systems for appropriate code compliance.
- 4. Confer with property owners, contractors, engineers, architects, and others regarding fire protection requirements and recommendations.
- 5. Represent the district in meetings, conferences, and committees; interact with private organizations, governmental agencies, architects, engineers, building and health agencies, law enforcement agencies, fire agencies, and other persons regarding fire and life safety, and investigative matters.
- 6. Conduct fire safety education programs.
- 7. Represent the district with other agencies.
- 8. Conduct training for other personnel regarding fire protection systems code enforcement and fire prevention.
- 9. Respond to incidents and performs tasks as assigned by the incident commander.
- 10. Prepare reports and maintain paper and electronic records.
- 11. Issue citations for serious code violations and perform other duties when corrective action is necessary.
- 12. Recommend to the fire chief changes and/or amendments to codes, laws, ordinances, and regulations. Advise the fire chief of legislation effecting the district and the successful operation of fire prevention services.
- 13. Appear in court as necessary.
- 14. Other duties may include Operations, Training and EMS tasks as assigned by the fire chief or a battalion chief.

Recommendation

Approve revised language on page 12 of the MOU between the District and Local 3577 and direct the fire chief to make the necessary edits.

Background

The Union and the District have an agreement in the current MOU to use California Voluntary Employee Benefit Association (CALGOVEBA) to help fund post employment healthcare expenses.

During a recent legal audit of the practices of the California Voluntary Employee Benefit Association (CALGOVEBA), the Board of Trustees have requested a few changes to the language in the Union MOU. The changes are minor, and are necessary for the plan to maintain tax exempt status. The changes have been agreed upon and approved by the Union leadership and CALGOVEBA.

IAFF Local 3577July 1, 2021– June 30, 2025

Article XI. BENEFITS Section 11.01 Healthcare

(a) Medical Insurance

- (i) The District has elected to contract with CalPERS to provide active employees and retirees with healthcare coverage through the PEMHCA medical plans.
- (ii) As required by PEMHCA, the District shall pay directly to CalPERS the monthly Minimum Employer Contribution (MEC) towards the PEMHCA medical plan insurance premium for each active employee and retiree who elects to enroll in a PEMHCA medical plan.
- (iii) The District agrees to pay CalPERS an amount of money on behalf of the active employee and his or her eligible dependents. The District paid amount, when combined with the MEC, shall be the equivalent of 97% of the monthly premium cost of the Bay Area PERS Choice PPO plan as the maximum allowable premium amount.

(b) Post-Employment Health - VEBA

- (i) The **District** agrees to participate in the California Government Voluntary Employee Benefit Association (CALGOVEBA) plan, which is intended to assist employees with planning for retirement health care expenses. All employees who are members of the bargaining unit are eligible to participate in the VEBA. Union employees' participation in the VEBA is mandatory and irrevocable. except as otherwise provided in this subsection.
- (ii) Beginning with the pay period that includes July 1, 2020, the District will cease any District contribution to the VEBA. On or after this date, all future contributions shall be employee contributions in the form of a vacation balance transfer at retirement.
- (iii) All elective payments made to the VEBA on employee's behalf shall be irrevocably paid to the California Government Voluntary Employee Benefit Association 501(c)(9) Trust. BAA Capital Advisors Inc. is the Trust Administrator.
- (iv) The Union agrees to indemnify and hold the District harmless against any claims, lawsuits, demands, penalties, or liability of any kind whatsoever that may arise against the District from the employee's participation in the VEBA, including taxes and liabilities relating to the VEBA's exempt status as a 501(c)(9) trust.
- (v) Employees may form sub-groups based on hire date. The sub-groups can determine the % of vacation balance transfer to the VEBA at retirement. Sub-groups can be added, deleted, or changed annually by the Union. Two employees shall be the minimum for a sub-group. Sub-groups will have the option to allocate 0%, 50% or 100% of their vacation balance to the VEBA at retirement. For employees not in a sub-group, the first employee to retire during the calendar year will determine the vacation allocation percentage to VEBA for that calendar year.

(vi) Employees who are Military Veterans will not participate in the VEBA.

Report on State Mandated Inspections

Recommendation

Approve Resolution 2022-1 acknowledging receipt of a report made by Administrative Captain Vandervoort of Scotts Valley Fire Protection District (SVFPD) regarding the state mandated annual inspection of certain occupancies pursuant to Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 of the California Health and Safety Code.

Discussion

Senate Bill 1205 (SB1205) passed in 2018 requires Fire Districts to report to their Board of Directors the status of state mandated inspections of certain occupancies. These are comprised of E (Educational), I (Institutional), R1 (Hotels/Motels), and R2 (Apartment Buildings). The Scotts Valley Fire Protection District has included C (Organized Camps), as they have large "lodge" buildings that could be included in the R1 occupancy classification. Within the Scotts Valley Fire Protection District we have identified 27 occupancies that fall into these categories.

For the calendar year 2021, the Scotts Valley Fire Protection District has completed inspections of all 27 occupancies within our jurisdiction. 11 occupancies failed their first inspection. 6 of those occupancies passed on re-inspection. The remaining 5 all have issues with extension cords and/or power strips and are actively working on getting remedies for those violations. There is one I (Institutional) occupancy in the district, the Santa Cruz County Juvenile Hall/Probation Center, which passed inspection this year. The State requires this occupancy to be inspected every other year, so it will be due again in 2023.

The 2019-2020 Santa Cruz County Civil Grand Jury released a report titled "Fire and Safety Inspections in Santa Cruz County" in the summer of 2020. One recommendation from the report is that fire departments report the state mandated inspection findings to the public, via department websites. The Scotts Valley Fire Protection District agreed to implement this following the next annual resolution approval from the Board. Attached to this report is our spreadsheet showing our findings for the completed annual inspections. This document will be posted to scottsvalleyfire.com following Board approval of resolution 2022-1.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-1

RESOLUTION ACKNOWLEDGING RECEIPT OF A REPORT MADE BY THE FIRE CHIEF OF THE SCOTTS VALLEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT (SVFPD) REGARDING THE STATE MANDATED ANNUAL INSPECTIONS OF CERTAIN OCCUPANCIES PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 13146.2 AND 13146.3 OF THE CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Section 13146.4 was added in 2018, and became effective on September 27, 2018; and,

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 requires all fire departments, including the SVFPD, that provide fire protection services to perform annual inspections in every building used as a public or private school, hotel, motel, lodging house, apartment house, and certain residential care facilities for compliance with building standards, as provided and,

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Section 13146.2 requires all fire departments, including the SVFPD, that provide fire protection services to report annually to its administering authority on its compliance with Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 and,

WHEREAS, the Board of the SVFPD intends this Resolution to fulfill the requirements of the California Health & Safety Code regarding acknowledgment of the SVFPD's compliance with California Health and Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of the SVFPD that said Board expressly acknowledges the measure of compliance of the SVFPD with California Health and Safety Code Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 in the area encompassed by the SVFPD, as follows:

A. EDUCATIONAL GROUP E OCCUPANCIES:

Educational Group E occupancies are generally those public and private schools, used by more than six persons at any one time for educational purposes through the 12th grade. Within the SVFPD, there lie twelve (12) Group E occupancies, buildings, structures and/or facilities.

During calendar year 2021, the SVFPD completed the annual inspection of twelve (12) Group E occupancies, buildings, structures and/or facilities. This is a compliance rate of 100 % for this reporting period.

B. RESIDENTIAL GROUP R OCCUPANCIES:

Residential Group R and C occupancies, for the purposes of this resolution, are generally those occupancies containing sleeping units, and include hotels, motels, apartments (three units or more), etc. as well as other residential occupancies (including a number of residential care facilities). These residential care facilities have a number of different sub-classifications, and they may contain residents or clients that have a range of needs, including those related to custodial care, mobility impairments, cognitive disabilities, etc. The residents may also be non-ambulatory or bedridden. Within the SVFPD, there lie twelve (12) Group R (and their associated sub-categories) and two (2) Group C occupancies of this nature.

During calendar year 2021, the SVFPD completed the annual inspection of twelve (12) Group R and two (2) Group C occupancies, buildings, structures and/or facilities. This is a compliance rate of 100 % for this reporting period.

C. INSTITUTIONAL GROUP I OCCUPANCIES

Group I occupancies are those occupancies in which care of supervision is provided to persons who are not capable of self-preservation without physical assistance or in which persons are detained for penal or correctional purposes. These occupancies generally include hospitals and correctional facilities or jails. These occupancies require inspection every other year. Within SVFPD there is 1 Group I occupancy. During calendar year 2021, SVFPD completed the inspection of our 1 occupancy falling under the Group I category. This is a compliance rate of 100% for this reporting period and will not require inspection again until 2023.

December Administrative Report

Administration

On 12/10/2021, the admin group attended the AFSS Northern Section Quarterly Training presented by Cal OES. The training focused on the California Fire Assistance Agreement and Salary Survey.

The Santa Cruz County Fire Agencies Insurance Group met in December to review the financial audit for FY 20/21, and conduct a claims review. There is ongoing discussion regarding the quality of our current medical physical and work comp medical provider. The County fire agencies are currently exploring other options.

The EMSIA JPA met to finalize the 21/22 budget, and to approve a revised job description for the EMSIA General Manager position.

The consultant hired by the County is continuing their process of interviewing all agencies served by the current radio system. I met with the representatives from Z Consulting to express our concerns and frustrations with our current system, as well as identify coverage and equipment failure issues.

We had one employee return to full duty after being off on a Work Comp injury for eight months. We still have one Captain off on a work related injury with no return to work date identified, and one Engineer off on a non-work related injury with an expected return to full duty at the end of February.

We experienced our first case of COVID at the end of December. Two employees have tested positive, each with mild symptoms. They are fulfilling their quarantine requirement, and should return to duty soon.

BC Stubendorff submitted our AFG grant request for new mobile and portable radios. Chief Stubendorff worked extremely hard putting this together, and the end product was very well done. We're hopeful for a grant award in the spring.

Operations

Command staff met to discuss the potential operational changes that would be needed to facilitate responding to calls for the Branciforte Fire District should that become necessary in the future.

E2512 experienced a starter failure over the holidays. Thank you to BC McNeil, Engineer Nehf and the B-Shift crew for removing the starter, driving to Salinas to pick-up a new one and replacing it. They also performed a full service while it was out of service. The Central shop has been backed up with work orders, so it's refreshing to see that our FF's are willing and capable of making some of these necessary repairs.

Training

All safety personnel completed their annual fit testing and CPR Training.

All shifts rotated through live fire training at the Ben Lomond Training Center. The training focused on forcible entry, nozzle forward evolutions, vent entry search and rescue operations. Engineers Pedemonte and Green were assistant instructors for the training.

All probationary training is progressing well and ahead of schedule.

Prevention

Admin Captain Vandervoort completed 5 new constructions inspections and is continuing to inspect the new homes at Polo Ranch as they progress.

He is also in the process of re-inspecting the State Mandated Occupancies to ensure compliance with the needed corrections. So far only the Scotts Valley public schools have not corrected violations, and he is working closely with them to gain compliance.

Letters have been sent out to businesses revoking temporary Covid-19 Outdoor Expansion Tent Guidelines. Businesses are required to be in compliance with the State and Local fire code.

Subject: January Administrative Report

Administration

I met with LAFCO Executive Officer Joe Serrano and Branciforte interim Fire Chief Sweeden regarding future discussion between the two agencies. It was decided that LAFCO will facilitate a joint Ad-Hoc committee meeting in February.

The Equipment and Facilities committee met to discuss future apparatus and equipment replacement as well as plans for the Erba Station Seismic upgrade project and the LaMadrona property. Also discussed was the status of the Marywood property on Glenwood Drive.

I attended the quarterly meeting of the Santa Cruz County Treasury Oversight Commission. The County Auditor-Controller-Treasurer-Tax Collector Edith Driscoll and County Investment Officer Brandon Marquez presented their quarterly investment report. The County continues to have a solid investment portfolio valued at \$1.1B dollars as of 12/31/2021.

The Admin Staff has been attending County Teams Meetings and testing Finance Enterprise, which is the County's new finance system. They have also attended monthly CalPERS webinars to stay up-to-date on the latest CalPERS changes and requirements.

Admin Bridges provided 5 car seat installations between December and January.

Operations

The District received a local grant for 2 new mobile radios. The mobile radios selected are Bendix King KNG mobiles and will be installed in the Type 3's ahead of this year's fire season.

Annual apparatus inspections have begun. E2512 and WT2550 have had their inspections completed. Other apparatus will be having their annual inspections conducted by an outside mechanic. E2512 also got new tires in January.

The new incident reporting software is up and running. Captains and AC's have a reported a smooth transition thus far. NFIRS reporting will now be required to be summitted monthly directly to FEMA.

EMS

BC Stubendorff will be attending a demonstration and training for an automatic CPR device known as the Lucas Device. The District will be demoing a unit for 90 days. Once in service training is complete and a formal procedure is in place the Lucas Device will be placed with the Battalion Chiefs to run on any cardiac arrest calls.

Titan III modems have been purchased for LP-15 monitors on E2511 and E2512. Pagoda is working with Lifenet Systems on configuration for the District. The EMSIA will be reimbursing the District \$555.00 for each device.

Training

Engineer Pedemonte has completed his Acting Captain training. His first assignment as an Acting Captain is February 1st.


The SCHMIT team held their quarterly training at the Watsonville Fire training center. The drill was facilitated by R.W Jones & Associates. The drill was originally planned to be a simulated ammonia leak at the Martinelli's plant in Watsonville, however it was scaled back due to COVID concerns. The training was focused on mandatory skills testing.

Prevention

Spring Lakes MHP has begun their water system upgrade. SLV Water district is installing new water mains and upgrading hydrants in the park, which will greatly increase fire flow.

Admin Captain Vandervoort completed 3 new construction inspections, including the ongoing Polo Ranch project. He also received 10 sets of plans for different City projects, 5 of which have been approved. He approved 9 sprinkler and/or alarm permits and completed the rough overhead sprinkler inspection of the new Target Store.
